Robbery near Mission Bay Hospital

On Sunday March 11, 2018, at approximately 6:00 a.m., a UCSF employee was robbed of a wallet, backpack and personal belongings, near Mission Bay Hospital. The employee parked his vehicle on the 600 block of Tennessee and was walking to work. A suspect approached the employee from behind, placed a hard unknown object in his lower back and ordered the employee to his knees. The suspect "pat searched" the employee, removing the employees backpack, Apple Watch from his left wrist and had the employee drop his car keys. The suspect picked up the keys and fled the scene, Southbound on Tennessee. The employee continued to the Children's Hospital where he notified security.

The Employee was not injured during this encounter. Fearing for his safety, the employee complied with the suspect demands and never turned around to view him. The employee believed the suspect was male based on voice only.

Personal Safety Tips:

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal safety measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of suspicious persons. Call UCSF PD if a suspicious person is seen loitering on campus.
- Travel in groups whenever possible, especially at night.
- Avoid poorly-lit or deserted areas when walking at night.
- Make use of the shuttle and escort services.
- Stay alert to your surroundings; avoid headphone and cell phone use when walking or waiting alone.
- If you are walking to your car, keep your car keys easily accessible, preferably in your hand.
- If you feel you are being followed, go into an open business and ask for help.
- Keep emergency numbers pre-programmed into your cellphone.
- If you are faced with demands for your money or property, especially from an armed subject, comply with their demands in the interest of your safety.
- Do not leave doors to buildings propped open.
- Prevent tailgating by closing all doors and gates behind you when entering or leaving.

Employees, staff, and students are asked to report any suspicious persons or circumstances to UCSF PD immediately and to dial 9-911 in the case of an emergency.
