Shooting near Mission Center Building

On Monday September 25, 2017, at approximately 2000 hours, UCSF Officers assisted SFPD with shots fired reported at the intersection of Folsom Street and 15th Street. Further investigation revealed two moving vehicles had been involved in an altercation, resulting in the occupant(s) of one vehicle firing multiple gunshots at the other vehicle. Both vehicles fled the area prior to officer's arrival. No injuries were reported at the scene. Bullet holes were located in an unoccupied, parked vehicle near the intersection as well as a PG&E electrical box.

Both vehicles involved in the incident were described as older sedans (No further description). There are no suspect descriptions at this time.

There was no damage to UCSF property.

SFPD is currently investigating the incident. Anyone with information regarding the incident is encouraged to call SFPD at 415-553-0123 (refer to SFPD case #170784308).

Personal Safety Tips:

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal safety measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of suspicious persons. Call UCSF PD if a suspicious person is seen loitering on campus.
- Travel in groups whenever possible, especially at night.
- Avoid poorly-lit or deserted areas when walking at night.
- Make use of the shuttle and escort services.
- Stay alert to your surroundings; avoid headphone and cell phone use when walking or waiting alone.
- If you are walking to your car, keep your car keys easily accessible, preferably in your hand.
- If you feel you are being followed, go into an open business and ask for help.
- Keep emergency numbers pre-programmed into your cell phone.
- If you are faced with demands for your money or property, especially from an armed subject, comply with their demands in the interest of your safety.
- Do not leave doors to buildings propped open.
- Prevent tailgating by closing all doors and gates behind you when entering or leaving.

Employees, staff, and students are asked to report any suspicious persons or circumstances to UCSF PD immediately and to dial 9-911 in the case of an emergency.
