

Theft Incidents at Parnassus Campus

This past weekend, at the Parnassus Campus, two separate laptop theft incidents were reported to the UCSF Police Department. In the first incident, a laptop was taken from a badge-access restricted laboratory on the 13th floor of the Health Sciences West building. In the second incident, a laptop was stolen from a locked office on the 11th floor of the Medical Sciences Building.

Additionally, a suspicious person was recently observed on the 13th floor of the Medical Sciences Building shaking door handles. The individual, shown below, was described as a black male adult, 6'0", 170-180 lbs., in his early 20s, wearing a white jacket and grey pants. If this individual is seen on campus, please contact UCSF PD immediately.



The UCSF Police Department is currently investigating these incidents. Anyone with information regarding these events is encouraged to contact the UCSF PD at 415-476-1414 and refer to cases 2017-44756 and 2017-44748.

Personal Safety Tips:

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal safety measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of suspicious persons. Call UCSF PD if a suspicious person is seen loitering on campus.
- Travel in groups whenever possible, especially at night.
- Avoid poorly-lit or deserted areas when walking at night.
- Make use of the shuttle and escort services.

- If you are faced with demands for your money or property, especially from an armed subject, comply with their demands in the interest of your safety.
- Do not leave doors to buildings propped open.
- Prevent tailgating by closing all doors and gates behind you when entering or leaving.

Employees, staff, and students are asked to report any suspicious persons or circumstances to UCSF PD immediately and to dial 9-911 in the case of an emergency.

Help fight crime by reporting suspicious activity to UCSF PD immediately. For emergency or in-progress events, dial 9-911 when using on-campus land lines and 415/476-6911 when using cell phones. For non-emergency calls, please dial 415/476-1414.
