## **Aggravated Assault w/Firearm 129 Hyde St. between Golden Gate Ave and Turk St. Street**

On November 18, 2016 at approximately 02:53 am a shooting took place at 129 Hyde Street between Golden Gate and Turk Street. One victim was injured during the shooting. The victim was transported to a nearby hospital. The suspect is still outstanding last seen on foot, westbound Golden Gate Street.

Motive and additional detail have not been established and currently under investigation by SFPD.

### **Suspect Description:**

Male Suspect- 5'-5" to 5'7", medium build, 20 years of age, black hair and mustache- tear drop tattoo left eye and tattoos on neck, wearing white tee shirt, blue jean pants, light color jacket with black hoodie.

### **Personal Safety Tips:**

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal safety measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of suspicious persons. Call UCSF PD if a suspicious person is seen loitering on campus.
- Travel in groups whenever possible, especially at night.
- Avoid poorly-lit or deserted areas when walking at night.
- Make use of the shuttle and escort services.
- Stay alert to your surroundings; avoid headphone and cell phone use when walking or waiting alone.
- If you are walking to your car, keep your car keys easily accessible, preferably in your hand.
- If you feel you are being followed, go into an open business and ask for help.
- Keep emergency numbers pre-programmed into your cell phone.
- If you are faced with demands for your money or property, especially from an armed subject, comply with their demands in the interest of your safety.
- Do not leave doors to buildings propped open.
- Prevent tailgating by closing all doors and gates behind you when entering or leaving.

**Employees, staff, and students are asked to report any suspicious persons or circumstances to SFPD, UCSF PD or UCSF PD Security immediately and to dial 9-911 in the case of an emergency.**
