Aggravated Assault at 60 Leavenworth St

The UCSF Police Department was notified earlier today of an aggravated assault which occurred at approximately 3:00 a.m. in front of 60 Leavenworth St, near the intersection with McAllister St. A white Ford van with black decals approached the victim near 60 Leavenworth St. An argument took place between the victim and the vehicle occupants. The van left the scene and returned several minutes later. A suspect on the passenger side of the van produced a pistol and fired several shots before driving northbound on Leavenworth St. The victim suffered a wound to the leg and declined medical attention.

No suspect information is currently available. No UC Hastings affiliates were involved in the incident.

Personal Safety Tips:

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal safety measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of persons acting in a suspicious manner. Call UCSF PD if a person acting in a suspicious manner is seen loitering on campus.
- Travel in groups whenever possible, especially at night.
- Avoid poorly lit or deserted areas when walking at night.
- Make use of the shuttle and escort services.
- Stay alert to your surroundings; avoid headphone and cell phone use when walking or waiting alone.
- If you are walking to your car, keep your car keys easily accessible, preferably in your hand.
- If you feel you are being followed, go into an open business and ask for help.
- Keep emergency numbers pre-programmed into your cell phone.
- If you are faced with demands for your money or property, especially from an armed subject, comply with their demands in the interest of your safety.
- Do not leave doors to buildings propped open.
- Prevent tailgating by closing all doors and gates behind you when entering or leaving.

Help fight crime by reporting persons acting in a suspicious manner and/or suspicious activity to UCSF PD immediately—race, gender, and religious affiliation are NOT considered suspicious.
