Aggravated Assault with Firearm - Hyde Street between Golden Gate Avenue and McAllister Street

The UCSF Police Department was informed earlier today of an incident involving an aggravated assault with a firearm which occurred on Hyde Street between Golden Gate Avenue and McAllister Street on Sunday, June 13, 2021, at 04:07 AM. Three victims were struck by gunfire by an unknown suspect. One of the victims was on campus property at the time. All three victims were later transported to San Francisco General Hospital for medical treatment.

The suspect was described as a male adult, 20-30 years of age, 5'2 120lbs, wearing a black beanie, with a black bandana face covering, white & black striped sweat suit and was last seen running westbound on McAllister Street.

There were no UC Hastings affiliates involved with this incident. The case is being investigated by the San Francisco Police Department. Anyone with information regarding this event is encouraged to contact SFPD at 415.553.0123 in reference to case number 210367107.

Personal Safety Tips:

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal safety measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of persons acting in a suspicious manner. Call UCSF PD if a person acting in a suspicious manner is seen loitering on campus.
- Travel in groups whenever possible, especially at night.
- Avoid poorly lit or deserted areas when walking at night.
- Make use of the shuttle and escort services.
- Stay alert to your surroundings; avoid headphone and cell phone use when walking or waiting alone.
- If you are walking to your car, keep your car keys easily accessible, preferably in your hand.
- If you feel you are being followed, go into an open business and ask for help.
- Keep emergency numbers pre-programmed into your cell phone.
- If you are faced with demands for your money or property, especially from an armed subject, comply with their demands in the interest of your safety.
- Do not leave doors to buildings propped open.
- Prevent tailgating by closing all doors and gates behind you when entering or leaving.

Employees, staff, and students are asked to report any suspicious persons or circumstances to UCSF PD immediately and to dial **911** in the case of an emergency.

Help fight crime by reporting suspicious persons and/or suspicious activity to UCSF PD immediately—race, gender, and religious affiliation are **NOT** considered suspicious. For emergency or in-progress events, dial 911 when using on-campus land lines and 415-476-6911 when using cell phones. For non-emergency calls, please dial 415-476-1414.
