Attempted Strong Arm Robbery near 100 McAllister

On February 13, 2017, a UC Hastings student reported to Police an Attempted Strong Armed Robbery in front of 100 McAllister. Victim stated that on Saturday, February 11, 2017 at approximately 08:00 p.m., she walked through a group of 4 black female juveniles and 2 black male juveniles when one of the males grabbed her backpack, pushed her into the wall, grabbed her pencil case and handed it to the other male within the group. The victim stated she recovered her pencil case. The suspects then fled Westbound on McAllister towards Van Ness Avenue on foot.

The victim described the first suspect as a black male, 16 to 17 years of age, about 5'8", thin build, dark complexion, thin shaved hair, clean shaven, wearing a light gray hooded sweatshirt and gray sweatpants.

The victim described the second suspect as a black male, 15 to 16 years of age, about 5'5" to 5'7", thin build, dark complexion, clean shaven, wearing a tri-colored hooded sweatshirt (red, white, and blue).

Personal Safety Tips:

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal safety measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of suspicious persons. Call UCSF PD if a suspicious person is seen loitering on campus.
- Travel in groups whenever possible, especially at night.
- Avoid poorly-lit or deserted areas when walking at night.
- Make use of the shuttle and escort services.
- Stay alert to your surroundings; avoid headphone and cell phone use when walking or waiting alone.
- If you are walking to your car, keep your car keys easily accessible, preferably in your hand.
- If you feel you are being followed, go into an open business and ask for help.
- Keep emergency numbers pre-programmed into your cell phone.
- If you are faced with demands for your money or property, especially from an armed subject, comply with their demands in the interest of your safety.
- Do not leave doors to buildings propped open.
- Prevent tailgating by closing all doors and gates behind you when entering or leaving.

Employees, staff, and students are asked to report any suspicious persons or circumstances to UCSF PD immediately and to dial 9-911 in the case of an emergency.
