Attempted Robbery Hugo St & 3rd Ave, San Francisco

On May 11, 2022, at approximately 0915 hours, an attempted robbery incident occurred near the intersection of Hugo Street and 3rd Avenue, San Francisco, CA. The survivor was pushed towards the ground by two suspects and the suspects attempted to take the survivor's property. The robbery attempt was unsuccessful, and the suspects fled the scene by running north bound on 3rd Avenue. No injuries requiring medical assistance resulted from the incident.

Suspect 1 is described as a female wearing a dark mask. Suspect 2 is described as a female wearing sunglasses and a hat.

This incident is under investigation by the San Francisco Police Department (SFPD). Anyone with information regarding this event is encouraged to contact SFPD at 415.553.0123 in reference to case number 221-310-865.

Personal Safety Tips:

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal safety measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of persons acting in a suspicious manner. Call UCSF PD if a person acting in a suspicious manner is seen loitering on campus.
- Travel in groups whenever possible, especially at night.
- Avoid poorly lit or deserted areas when walking at night.
- Make use of the shuttle and escort services.
- Stay alert to your surroundings; avoid headphone and cell phone use when walking or waiting alone.
- If you are walking to your car, keep your car keys easily accessible, preferably in your hand.
- If you feel you are being followed, go into an open business, and ask for help.
- Keep emergency numbers pre-programmed into your cell phone.
- If you are faced with demands for your money or property, especially from an armed subject, comply with their demands in the interest of your safety.
- Do not leave doors to buildings propped open.
- Prevent tailgating by closing all doors and gates behind you when entering or leaving.
