Indecent Exposure at Medical Sciences Building

On February 04, 2017 at approximately 2030 hours, A UCSF employee reported an indecent exposure on the first floor lobby of 513 Parnassus Ave, near the elevators. The male suspect pulled down his pants, exposing his genitals to the victim employee. The suspect grabbed his genitals and made several derogatory remarks directed at the victim employee. The suspect left the building and was last seen walking westbound on Parnassus Ave. Security and Police responded but did not locate the suspect.

The suspect is described as a black male adult, approximately 40-50 years old with short disheveled curly hair and skinny to medium build. He was last seen wearing a red jacket, reddish pants and a hat.

The UCSF Police Department is currently investigating this incident. Anyone with information regarding this event is encouraged to contact the UCSF PD at 415-476-1414.

Personal Safety Tips:

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal safety measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of suspicious persons. Call UCSF PD if a suspicious person is seen loitering on campus.
- Travel in groups whenever possible, especially at night.
- Avoid poorly-lit or deserted areas when walking at night.
- Make use of the shuttle and escort services.
- Stay alert to your surroundings; avoid headphone and cell phone use when walking or waiting alone.
- If you are walking to your car, keep your car keys easily accessible, preferably in your hand.
- If you feel you are being followed, go into an open business and ask for help.
- Keep emergency numbers pre-programmed into your cell phone.
- If you are faced with demands for your money or property, especially from an armed subject, comply with their demands in the interest of your safety.
- Do not leave doors to buildings propped open.
- Prevent tailgating by closing all doors and gates behind you when entering or leaving.

Employees, staff, and students are asked to report any suspicious persons or circumstances to UCSF PD immediately and to dial <u>9-911</u> in the case of an emergency.
