Robbery near Mount Zion Campus

On Monday September 18, 2017, at approximately 2:30 p.m., a UCSF employee was robbed of a backpack near the Mount Zion campus. The employee was walking eastbound on the north side of Geary Boulevard between Scott Street and Steiner Street when the employee was pushed to the ground, and his backpack was forcibly removed from his shoulder. Two suspects were observed running southeast across Geary Boulevard toward Raymond Kimbell Playground located at Geary Boulevard and Steiner Street.

The first suspect was described as a Hispanic male, 16-17 years old, 5'8" to 5'9", short hair, thin build, light skin, wearing a red hoodie. The second suspect was described as a black male, 16-17 years old, 5'8" to 5'10", short-afro hair style, athletic build, wearing a grey hoodie.

The UCSF Police Department is currently investigating this incident. Anyone with information regarding this event is encouraged to contact the UCSF PD at 415-476-1414 and refer to case 2017-36700.

Personal Safety Tips:

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal safety measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of suspicious persons. Call UCSF PD if a suspicious person is seen loitering on campus.
- Travel in groups whenever possible, especially at night.
- Avoid poorly-lit or deserted areas when walking at night.
- Make use of the shuttle and escort services.
- Stay alert to your surroundings; avoid headphone and cell phone use when walking or waiting alone.
- If you are walking to your car, keep your car keys easily accessible, preferably in your hand.
- If you feel you are being followed, go into an open business and ask for help.
- Keep emergency numbers pre-programmed into your cell phone.
- If you are faced with demands for your money or property, especially from an armed subject, comply with their demands in the interest of your safety.
- Do not leave doors to buildings propped open.
- Prevent tailgating by closing all doors and gates behind you when entering or leaving.

Employees, staff, and students are asked to report any suspicious persons or circumstances to UCSF PD immediately and to dial 9-911 in the case of an emergency.
