Burglary from 505 Parnassus

On Thursday, June 15, 2017 at approximately 8:45 a.m. UCSF PD was notified regarding the theft of five laptop computers and two sets of UCSF keys from the 10th floor of Moffitt Hospital.

The theft occurred on the 10th floor when the unknown suspect used a pry tool to enter a locked office and retrieve keys from a drawer. The suspect used the keys to open a locked cabinet and remove five laptop computers. The key ring contained keys that open several locations, and an order was placed to re-key those rooms.

It appears the thefts occurred between Wednesday 06/14/17 at 5:30 pm and Thursday 06/15/17 at 8:30 am. A possible suspect in this case is described as a white male adult, approximately 30 years of age, 6' tall, heavy set build, with light brown or blond short hair, clean cut, wearing large round glasses, and blue jeans.

This incident is currently under investigation by UCSF PD. Anyone having information that may be helpful in solving this crime can contact UCSF PD at 415/476-1414 and refer to cases number 2017-21194.

Laptop and Computer Theft Prevention Tips:

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal security measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of suspicious persons in and around HSE & HSW. Call UCSF PD if a suspicious person is seen loitering on campus.
- Be vigilant of suspicious activity in your area. If you see something that doesn't look right, call UCSF PD.
- Ensure your laptop has the latest encryption software installed.
- Ensure your laptop is protected by a strong password only known by you.
- Never leave your laptop unattended. Take it with you whenever possible.
- Make sure your office is always locked when left unoccupied, even for short periods of time.
- Record your laptop's serial number, make and model number. This information will be needed by UCSF PD.
- Notify UCSF PD immediately and without delay if your laptop is stolen.

Employees, staff, and students are asked to report any suspicious persons or circumstances to UCSF PD immediately and to dial 9-911 in the case of an emergency.

Help fight crime by reporting suspicious activity to UCSF PD immediately. For emergency or in-progress events, dial 9-911 when using on-campus land lines and 415/476-6911 when using cell phones. For non-emergency calls, please dial 415/476-1414.
