## ***UC Regents Meeting November 16-18, 2021, at UCSF Mission Bay Campus***

The UCSF Police Department would like to inform you that the **UC Regents Meeting will be held at the Mission Bay campus on Tuesday, November 16 through Thursday, November 18**. We are taking precautions to protect both the First Amendment rights of demonstrators and the safety of our campus community.

The UCSF Police Department would like to remind everyone that operations at the Rutter Community Center will be reduced to a single-point of entry for the duration of the UC Regents Meeting. Additionally, those seeking access to the gym may be asked to use an alternate entrance.

**During the Regents meetings, the Mission Bay campus experiences a greater number of visitors which can cause traffic and pedestrian disruptions. During this event it is also possible that we may experience demonstrations.** The following safety precautions are recommended:

- Avoid the Mission Bay campus or limit unnecessary trips in and around the Mission Bay Community Center area on November 16-18, 2021, if possible.
- Keep perimeter doors to Mission Bay buildings closed and locked to avoid disruptions and watch for individuals piggy-backing into secure locations.
- Avoid delays by planning ahead and having an alternate route/schedule to Mission Bay if you must be on the campus that day.
- Deliveries to Genentech Hall loading dock will be re-routed to Byers Hall loading dock.
- If you plan on using UCSF shuttles that serve Mission Bay, we do not expect delays.
- If unauthorized or persons acting in a suspicious manner occupy any part of your building or work area:
  - Immediately call UCSF police and report the activity.
  - Do not attempt to confront or remove them yourself.
  - Lock your office and leave the area if possible.
  - Remember to take all personal belongings with you.
- Be aware of your surroundings at all times.
- Report any suspicious activities to the UCSF Police Department at 9-911 from a campus phone or 415/476-1414 from any other phone.
