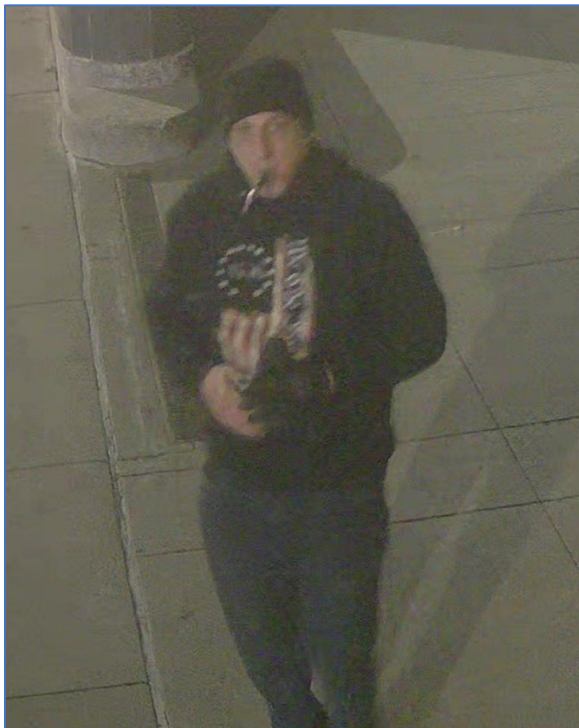

Mount Zion and Mission Bay Vandalism Suspect

The UCSF Police Department wishes to inform you that we are no longer looking for the subject in the pictures depicted below. Through intense investigation, information sharing, and input from our UCSF community, the UCSF Police Department was able to positively identify this subject.

Working in cooperation with our neighboring law enforcement agencies, the San Francisco Police Department and the San Mateo Sheriff's Department, the UCSF Police Department was able to take this subject into custody without incident and before he committed additional acts of vandalism. He was booked into the San Francisco County jail early this morning on (86) eighty-six counts of felony vandalism.

Personal Safety Tips:

Suspects look for crimes of opportunity and certain personal safety measures can be followed to minimize your chances of becoming a victim. These are:

- Be vigilant of persons acting in a suspicious manner. Call UCSF PD if a person acting in a suspicious manner is seen loitering on campus.
- Travel in groups whenever possible, especially at night.
- Avoid poorly lit or deserted areas when walking at night.
- Make use of the shuttle and escort services.
- Stay alert to your surroundings; avoid headphone and cell phone use when walking or waiting alone.
- If you are walking to your car, keep your car keys easily accessible, preferably in your hand.
- If you feel you are being followed, go into an open business, and ask for help.
- Keep emergency numbers pre-programmed into your cell phone.
- If you are faced with demands for your money or property, especially from an armed subject, comply with their demands in the interest of your safety.
- Do not leave doors to buildings propped open.
- Prevent tailgating by closing all doors and gates behind you when entering or leaving.

Help fight crime by reporting persons acting in a suspicious manner and/or suspicious activity to UCSF PD immediately—race, gender, and religious affiliation are NOT considered suspicious. For emergency or in-progress events, dial 911 when using on-campus land lines and (415) 476-6911 when using cell phones. For non-emergency calls, please dial (415) 476-1414.
