UCSF Police Safety Bulletin, Update #3

CDC Updates its COVID-19 Travel Health Notices

Members of the UCSF community should be aware of updated travel guidance based on the current risk level of COVID-19 as determined by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Please check the [CDC's information for travel webpage](https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/) <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/> regularly for the latest information.

Currently, the CDC uses the following system for conveying health notices about COVID-19 risk of traveling to a country or parts of a country:

- Widespread sustained and ongoing transmission and restrictions on entry into the United States: Avoid all non-essential travel to China and Iran. (Both Level 3 Travel Health Notice)
- Widespread sustained and ongoing transmission in these destinations: Avoid all non-essential travel to South Korea and Italy. (Both Level 3 Travel Health Notice)
- Sustained and ongoing community transmission: Older adults and those who have chronic medical conditions should consider postponing travel to Japan. (Level 2 Travel Health Notice)

All members of the UCSF community who are returning to the United States from any country with a Level 3 Travel Health Notice need to stay home and monitor their health upon return to the United States for 14 days. Those returning from a country with a Level 2 Travel Health Notice need to monitor their health for 14 days. Travelers from Level 3 and 2 countries need to contact either Occupational Health Services (for faculty, residents, fellows and staff) or Student Health & Counseling (for students) and follow the steps outlined under guidance for traveling internationally on [UCSF's coronavirus website](https://www.ucsf.edu/coronavirus) <https://www.ucsf.edu/coronavirus>.
