## ***Impacts to UCSF: 2020 Election Demonstrations***

The UCSF Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is activated to Level 2 to actively monitor regional activity, provide situational awareness, and coordinate response, as needed, for the 2020 national election.

Daily election demonstrations are scheduled throughout the region. While there is no credible threat to UCSF or UC Hastings, the EOC continues to monitor closely with UCSF Health Hospital Command Centers (HCC).

Heavy traffic and pedestrian congestion are expected in Oakland and San Francisco throughout the day. The event may bring additional people onto UCSF campus properties. Please contact UCSF Police Department if suspicious individuals or activity is observed on campus. If you See Something, Say Something by calling 415.476.1414. There are no known activities that would impact the UCSF Fresno regional campus. To report Fresno concerning activity, please call Fresno security 559.499.6401 when on campus.

There is a possibility that traffic delays across the San Francisco Bay Area may occur throughout the day and into the evening. For faculty, staff, students, and hospital visitors who would like escorts to or from hospital, please contact hospital security directly by calling 415.885.7890.
